Pastoral Messages:

Dear Parents of DIA Emirates Hills,



We would like to inform you that the punctuality procedure at DIA Emirates Hills has been altered from yesterday, 2nd January 2024, ahead of the commencement of Term 2.

For some students there has been a worrying figure to this point in the year, 15 school weeks, of students arriving late to school and the impact that this can have on your child's attainment and progress. While this is a small sample size, 15 school weeks, it would be expected that this level will reduce over the coming months and your support would be greatly appreciated with this. You will have been contacted by email or phone call by myself or your child's respective Head of Year if this affects you. To those of you who are always punctual, we thank you.

All students are expected to be in Homeroom in school no later than 7.30am and so far this year 94%+ of all students have been on time. If they arrive after this time they are marked late by their Homeroom tutor. If they arrive between 7.40am and 9.30am they should proceed to the secondary school office to obtain a late ticket before going to lessons. Students will be marked as 'excused late' if prior email communication has come from parent / guardian to Ms. Evelyn Pakatan (<u>evelynp@diadubai.com</u>) and the student presents physical or digital evidence of medical appointment, visa visit, RTA driving test etc.

Students will NOT be permitted entry to school after 9.30am without physical or digital evidence of medical appointment, visa visit, RTA driving test etc. If a student is unfit to make it school because of medical reasons before 9.30am, and has not sought medical appointment, then it should be deemed that they are too unwell to attend school that day. If there has been a traffic incident which causes significant issues in the areas used to access the school these may be excused, but general lateness and/or oversleeping will not be excused.



During these events, scholars exhibit their debating, creative writing, test taking, and teamwork skills. 


I think that I really pushed myself for the bronze trip and it was a challenge like no other.


ALPHA News


