






# DIA students attend Model Congress Leadership Conference at Harvard University






The skills they learned will help them become leaders and prepare for the attending university in the future.




SCHOOL PRODUCTION 2024





In TOK, our DP1 students have been immersing themselves in an in-depth exploration of the five Areas of Knowledge. This journey is facilitated through a dynamic educational environment, where TOK instructors utilize their specialized expertise to enrich the students' learning experience. The students are also being introduced to the TOK exhibition, their internal assessment, where they will showcase their refined critical thinking skills. We anticipate a remarkable exhibition in May.

DP2 students are culminating their TOK journey by applying their accumulated knowledge to their final TOK essays. This year's essay titles are intellectually stimulating and diverse, covering a range of thought-provoking topics. Our DP2 students are diligently finalizing these

essays, drawing from the extensive knowledge they have developed in their subjects. Their deep engagement with these complex topics reflects a mature understanding of the intricate nature of knowledge itself.





#### **Integrated into Subjects:**

ATLs are not taught as standalone subjects but are integrated throughout the MYP curriculum. They are designed to support students in acquiring the necessary skills to inquire, think critically, communicate effectively, and engage in self-reflection.

ATL in the MYP complements and strengthens the principles of inquiry-based learning. It provides students with the skills and attitudes necessary to engage in independent inquiry, fostering a lifelong love of learning and the ability to think critically and creatively in a variety of contexts.

























