## **Head of Primary's Message**

### **Healthy Lunchbox Reminder**

Turning to a matter of daily school life, I'd like to remind everyone about our lunchbox guidelines. We encourage packed lunches to be nutritious and balanced, excluding chocolates, sweets and sugary drinks. Nuts are not permitted in any form, including peanut butter or Nutella type spreads as we have a number of staff and students with nut allergies. Ideally, lunchboxes should include a source of protein and carbohydrates, along with a portion of fruits and vegetables. Healthy snack options can be cereal bars, rice cakes, breadsticks with dips, or dried fruit. Additionally, please reinforce with your children that food swapping is not permitted for health and safety reasons.

A big thank you is due to the increased number of parents wearing badges. For those without, adhering to our security process and obtaining a visitor's badge is much appreciated. It is also heartening to see parents kindly reminding each other about this policy, enhancing the safety and security of our school environment.
