# Head of Primary's Message

Dear DIA Families,

#### Sustainability Award and Visit from the Director General of KHDA

DIAEH's recognition in the 'World's Best School Awards' for sustainability has been a long journey, culminating in this week's awards ceremony. While we didn't secure first place, being named among the top three globally highlights our distinctive approach. Our sustainability efforts are student-driven, fostering a legacy of advocacy for internationally-minded, sustainable practices, from our youngest KGs experimenting with planting to our Year 5 and 6s excelling at Junior Model United Nations, and everywhere in between.

#### Key initiatives include:

- Curriculum design with several units focusing on sustainability, supported by Year Group Exhibitions.
- Action Ambassadors and the Eco Council leading projects.
- · The first-ever Model United Nations for Juniors.
- Our 'Taking Action' celebratory posters each week.
- The GIVE (Gift of Innoventures Education) philanthropic initiative, which has built nine schools in Nepal.
- Generating maximum permitted power through rooftop solar panels.
- Community support through Second-Hand Uniform drives.
- Lastly, though not covering everything, it's incredible to see what this learning in Primary becomes when students move to Senior School. The number of truly student-led initiatives is mind-blowing.

This recognition affirms our commitment to empowering students to lead the way in sustainability, and believe me, there is so much more in the works right now. Thanks to our student council for raising funds and the dedicated contributions from some of our parent community members, particularly Ms. Kathy, our parent author, and Ms. Maria, who successfully led the Kiss and Drop painting initiative. Our Green Room is being renovated and will soon be a source of home-grown crops and experimentation.

Our pride was further magnified by a historic visit from the Director General of the KHDA, Her Excellency Aisha Miran, who honored us by participating in our ongoing '20,001 Trees' initiative. This not only supports our sustainable efforts, and those of the UAE, but also marks 20 years of Innoventures Education at DIA. The event was marked by the presence of our Eco and Action council members. Zayaan Farooqui from Year 5 gave an inspiring speech that highlighted the depth of our students' engagement in sustainability, delivered with such confidence and expression.

The ceremony started with a memorable performance of 'We Are The World' by our Upper School Choir, a favorite of our CEO, Ms. Poonam, and concluded with heartfelt thanks from our Head Boy and Girl, Ayaan and Rihanna. This event not only celebrated our achievements but also reinforced our commitment to nurturing responsible, environmentally aware students.

#### Indian Arts Day of Light and Colour - Next Friday


