Dear Parents,

We have spoken with a number of teachers and parents and have made the decision to adapt the Year 1-6 pick up waiting areas. We understand fully that parents wish to wait out of the sun and equally know you want your children to be kept safe at all times. For this reason we please ask you read the following and be ready for its implementation.

From Tuesday the 31st all parents who wish to wait inside may use the rear canteen extension. No adults will be permitted into the main section of the cafeteria. We will open the side canteen doors to allow parents in and out of the space, but ask that you do not cross the barriers which divide the two sections.

Once your child is brought outside by the teacher to their designated area then please go out and collect your child. It is also possible to view the specific pick up areas from the extension which should help speed up the process of knowing when classes are out. If you then need to wait for a sibling you may do this in the rear extension.

The only people permitted to be in the main part of the cafeteria will be primary school students who are being collected by older siblings or, after 3:05, those who are late and need somewhere to wait safely.

Myself and Ms. Stephanie will be on hand to guide and observe and any feedback is welcomed.


Discussion categories


