



# SECONDARY SCHOOL NEWS

## DIA ATTENDS 50<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL THIMUN IN THE HAGUE, NETHERLANDS

In the week beginning January 28<sup>th</sup>, a group of 26 DIA students participated in the 50<sup>th</sup> annual installment of The Hague International Model United Nations. Attracting over 3,500 students each year, it is the largest event of its kind in the world and DIA is a regular participant. In addition, we were honored to have one of our students, Aditya Rathi, serve as the Deputy Secretary-General of the conference. Our two MUN directors at DIA, Ms. Meena Nambiar and Mr. Vikas Singh accompanied us on this trip.

Due to the relatively large size of our team, we were allocated two different delegations, Saint Lucia and Congo. DIA had a significant presence throughout the committees, with at least one delegate in each of the six General Assemblies, the Environmental Commission, the Human Rights Council, the Special Conference, and the Sustainable Development Commission. The General Assembly touched base on a wide range of issues from nationalism to nuclear weapons, while the other forums concentrated on their own specific issues. Furthermore, Ayush Walia and Adam Abdulla served as the Ambassadors of Saint Lucia and Congo respectively, and were responsible for bearing the flags of their delegations at the Walk of the Nations, a staple of THIMUN.



The main theme for this semicentennial was "Building Civil

Society Through Education." A quality education empowers people to live healthy and sustainable lives while fostering tolerance and acceptance, allowing for a civil society.



Apart from making a lasting impact on THIMUN, we also set aside time to visit other cities within the Netherlands. We began our journey in Volendam, a rural town just outside Amsterdam, in which we visited a cheese farm and had an extensive tasting session afterwards. The next day, we returned to Amsterdam and saw some of Vincent Van Gogh's best paintings, and had the chance to explore the city. Despite the cold and the rain, it was an enjoyable experience for all. The day concluded with a cruise across the capital's seemingly infinite network of canals. The last stop was Rotterdam, a city that was rebuilt after World War II and blends many different architecture styles. We took a ride down the Erasmus Bridge before treating ourselves to a shopping trip in the city center. Throughout the trip, communication lines were always open between the students, teachers, and parents.

Above all, the highlight of the trip, for most of us, was our ability to build a stronger bond and camaraderie with each other, through the dinners to the long bus rides. Through this trip, we were able to reflect on the past, strengthen our understanding of global issues in the present, and prepare ourselves to become the leaders of the future.

## MY EXPERIENCE: THE HISTORY BEE 2018 BY VEDANG LAMBE

The History Bee and Bowl is an international contest for high school history aficionados which can qualify you for the International History Olympiad that's held in Berlin. The History Bee and Bowl 2018 took place on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of February at Dubai College. There were 40 high school students from schools all over Dubai who competed for the top 5 ranks, which basically meant eligibility for the Asian Championship.

The 25 topics from world history that were provided with the study material were all quite new to me. The Bee tests your ability to give one-word answers to the hints that are provided with a general question. I had started preparing for the contest for more than 2 months. My history teacher was really very helpful. When she realized my interest, she helped me pick out useful books for this competition.

While history at DP level is quite new to me, I have always been fascinated by the study of the past. It was purely this drive that kept me persevering through studying 25 topics spanning 3000 years of Human history.

The competition was fierce. All 20 contestants in my category were from Year 13. These contestants were literally the best of the best, selected by their schools through intra-school qualifying rounds. Although this environment was quite intimidating, I attempted to maintain my cool and just focus on the questions. Questions ranged from the mathematics of ancient Egypt to Medieval England to the Cold War.

There were some questions I could answer, some I couldn't. I tried not to lose hope if I got a question wrong. I feel I was most comfortable answering questions from topic we had covered in school. Finally, when the scores were tallied, we found out that I was actually among the finals qualifiers. It was unbelievable. This experience taught me that it's not just hard work that pays off but also the interest to go beyond academics to do something you really enjoy. I really fell in love with History thanks to this opportunity. As for what lies ahead, I hope to participate in the Berlin History Olympiad over the summer.
