NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL CLINIC





Causally talking to some parents, I was surprised to learn that Vaping, e-cigarette use has become quite widespread in Middle and High Schools all over the world. This is definitely a cause for concern.

It is important for us as parents to know about this somewhat 'new' form of addiction. So, what is 'Vaping, Juuling'? Vaping means using an electronic cigarette (e-cigarette). It is referred to as vaping because of the tiny puffs of vapor that are produced when using the device.



E-cigarettes are battery powered and deliver nicotine through a liquid called e-juice, which turns into a vapor when used in the device. The liquid, which comes in various flavors such as mint, fruit, and bubble gum, appeals to the kids. The amount of nicotine in the liquid can be the same or even more than in a cigarette. The device looks like a USB. So, parents please be aware. Equip yourselves with the knowledge of vaping and talk to your children about the dangers of vaping.

Unlike cigarettes there is no smell involved while vaping and no fire alarm is set off as it is a vapor and not 'smoke'. These items can be bought over the internet and students can order them and pay with cash on delivery —a scary situation indeed.

Among youth, e-cigarettes are more popular than any traditional tobacco product. In 2015, the U.S. surgeon general reported that e-cigarette use among high school students had increased by 900 percent, and 40 percent of young ecigarette users had never smoked regular tobacco.

According to Blaha, (from Johns Hopkins university) there are three reasons e-cigarettes may be particularly enticing to young people. First, many teens believe that vaping is less harmful than smoking. Second, e-cigarettes have a lower per-use cost than traditional cigarettes. Finally, vape cartridges are often formulated with flavorings such as apple pie and watermelon that appeal to younger users.

Both youths and adults find the lack of smoke appealing. With no smell, e-cigarettes reduce the stigma of smoking. "What I find most concerning about the rise of vaping is that people who would've never smoked otherwise, especially youth, are taking up the habit," says Blaha. "It's one thing if you convert from cigarette smoking to vaping. It's quite another thing to start up nicotine use with vaping. And, it often leads to using traditional tobacco products down the road."

Well done to our wonderful Arabic staff and our adventurous learners.









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
THE RIGHT KIND OF LOUD







