Every year the World Scholar's Cup competition centres round a theme and this year it was A World on the Margins. Students study 6 subjects - History, Social Studies, Literature, Arts and Music, Science and Special Areas and the resources for each subject are related to the year's theme. There are 4 events in the competition - Debate, Collaborative Writing, Scholar's Bowl (quiz) and Scholar's Challenge (multiple choice questions on each subject).

Pretty intimidating, isn't it? The competition tests a student's academic merit, debating skills, creative and persuasive writing acumen, critical thinking skills as well as the ability to map connections between subjects and global events.

NEWS FROM THE SWEDISH MOTHER TONGUE PROGRAMME

Celebrating the Cinnamon Roll Day

It might not be the National Day of Sweden, but if you ask the Swedish students at DIA the Cinnamon Roll Day is equally important!

It falls on October 4th each year and celebrates the national pastry of Sweden, the Cinnamon roll. Although a fairly new celebration, started in 1999, it has grown very popular amongst Swedes all around the world. The Cinnamon roll plays an essential part in Swedish culture and is usually accompanied by a cup of coffee or juice, known as 'fika'. It means taking a break and enjoy some time in the good company of family, friends or colleagues. This is a widely spread tradition in all Swedish workplaces and homes atleast twice a day.

You might recognize the typical Swedish pastry from a certain furniture store, but the homemade ones served in Swedish mother tongue class last week taste quite differently.

Try for yourself!

Recepie

Ingredients

(25 buns) 35 g (1¼ oz) yeast 100 g (3½ oz) sugar 300 ml (1½ cup) milk

1 egg

120 g (4 oz) butter

1 tsp salt

1 tbs ground cardemom

750 g (26 oz) flour

Filling

100 g (4 oz) butter 50 g (2 oz) sugar 2 tbs cinammon

Glaze

1 egg

2 tbs water

pearl sugar (or normal sugar if not available)

Preparation

Crumble the yeast in a bowl and stir in a few tablespoons of milk. Melt the butter and pour the milk on it. Add the rest of the ingredients and knead the dough in a dough mixer for 10–15 minutes. Let the dough rise while covered at room temperature for 30 minutes.

Roll out the dough so it is about 3 mm (1/8 in) thick and 30 cm (12 in) wide. Spread the room-temperature butter on top. Make a mixture of sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle it over the dough. Roll the dough the long way and cut the roll into about 25 slices. Place them with the cut edge upward in paper molds. Place on a baking sheet and let rise under a towel for about 60 minutes or until the buns have doubled in size.

Beat together the egg and water, brush the mixture carefully on the buns and sprinkle pearl sugar on top. Bake in the oven $(220^{\circ}\text{C}/425^{\circ}\text{F})$ for 5–6 minutes. Allow to cool on a rack.


GATEWAY SCIENCE STUDENTS VISIT THE MOHAMMED BIN RASHID SPACE CENTER
