DIA- EH recently celebrated the culmination of the Middle Years Programme journey for our year 11 students.




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
Our group consists of 3 different group members, Arhaan, Nicholas and Nirvan.

TOK Exhibition


TOK aims to make students aware of the interpretative nature of knowledge, including personal ideological biases whether these biases are retained, revised or rejected.

It offers students and their teachers the opportunity to:

reflect critically on diverse ways of knowing and on areas of knowledge consider the role and nature of knowledge in their own culture, in the cultures of others and in the wider world.

The TOK exhibition requires the students to create a presentation of three objects that explores how TOK manifests in the world around us. This week our Year 12 students displayed the breadth and diversity of their explorations in TOK with a phenomenal showcase of their studies and an interactive panel discussion.
