

PYP Sports, Co-Curricular Activities and Performing Arts Student opportunities are a cornerstone of DIA life, between class assemblies, school productions, trips, residentials, winter and summer concerts, a newly added Arts Week, choir, squads and an array of CCAs, we provide a wide range of additional opportunities for the students of DIA. This included over 500 competitive fixtures this year, up from 290 in the previous year.

Mother Tongue

As a school with an extended international community, Dubai International Academy Emirates Hills prides itself on its efforts to celebrate diversity and promote inclusion. One of the ways in which this is achieved, is through the extensive Mother Tongue Programme offered across Primary and Secondary sections of the school, either incurriculum or as extra-curricular engagement.

The programme aims at promoting respect and intercultural understanding. Continuing instruction in Mother Tongue, even when students are away from home, fosters a sense of identity and belongingness, through maintaining touch with their cultural and language heritage. The languages are taught by native speakers who are qualified to teach languages. To maintain continuity, the curriculum is adapted from the home country, following specific outcomes by age/grade.

The lessons are mapped against the Islamic Studies lessons and are taught within the time table for most of the languages. The groups sizes are small, allowing personalized attention. The programme is organized by reputable private institutes or as a voluntary initiative by parents. The school provides support through logistics and coordination.

The initiative begun 15 years ago, has successfully seen addition of new languages every year, building a strong sense of community. Currently DIA offers French, Spanish, Hindi, Finnish, German, Dutch, Danish, Swedish, Italian, Russian, Mandarin, Turkish, Polish, Greek and Farsi, and always open to the idea of starting more.



Inclusion in DIA Primary

At DIA, we believe in the inherent capacity of every child to dream, inspire and achieve. We adopt the Graduated System of Support (GSS), an internationally researched model, providing different levels of support in response to varying student needs. Working collaboratively with students, parents, teachers, and experts, we aim to create a nurturing environment where each student is valued and empowered to reach their true potential. Please see the table below that outlines the support provided for various areas of need.

Sometimes parents like to support by hosting activities within the class. This can be arranged through the class teachers and Head of Year. As an international school, there could be a celebration every week and as such it is important that we a mindful of the curriculum and that we will not be able to celebrate all World Days. You will find the approved whole school days in our calendar.



Class Reps Guidance and Support Information

Class Parent Reps

As one of our Drivers, our 'community relationships' plays an essential part in what makes Dubai International Academy unique and exceptional school. Class or year group parent representatives play an important role in maintaining strong community links.

What is a Class Parent Representative?

Primary

• In primary we have a class rep per class. A class representative is a conduit between school and home and a welcoming face for all parents in your section. You offer your support and your thoughts and drive positive community spirit from within the parent body. One of these class reps then becomes a PADIA Rep and liaises with the Core PADIA Team.

Secondary

• In secondary we have year reps who perform a similar role to primary, however is 1 per Year Group and they liaise with the Core PADIA Team.

How do I become a Rep?

This year I (Mr. Tom) would like to have more contact with reps and therefore please <u>complete this form that registers your interest</u>. This will give me all contact details of reps in a central location. If more than one person wishes to fulfil the role then we will look at the following (with the teachers) to create balance:

- Number of years at DIA
- Number of years as a Rep (experience in the role is important, though we balance a degree of change as well)
- Relationship with the school (it is important that reps are able to be a positive influence for / on parents)

Can I do the Rep role alone?

Yes, in fact, that is how the majority of people have maintained the role in the past. If during the year you would like some help there are usually plenty of volunteers though. The reason for having only one contact is so that the school knows who to call in the event of urgent information needing to be discussed or shared.

The Role of the Rep:

- Be a welcoming face for new families and welcome them to the school community
- Attend discussion forums led by the school
- Assist and sometimes consult on communications from school
- Positively contribute to discussions about school improvement with school management
- Encourage and provide opportunities for parents to be involved in school life.
- Organise opportunities for parents in your child's class to meet socially, e.g., morning tea events, informal social gatherings such as a coffee morning at a local coffee shop, or a class weekend play date in a local park.
- Be supportive of school staff and our whole school vision.
- Keep in contact with your teacher to discuss class needs and any areas they need help, e.g., distributing information.
- Support in arranging any gifts for staff for those parents wanting to collectively contribute but also ensuring this is optional.
- To promote inclusivity in all class activities.
- ONE rep from the year group will also be a PADIA rep, who meets with the Core PADIA Team.

NB: There are to be no 'class funds' collected and managed by the rep at the start of the year. Individual collections for certain initiatives may occur, however these must be optional and must not discriminate.

What should I do first as a Rep?

Once you have been confirmed as a Class or year Representative, there are a few suggestions on what you could do to get started:

- Talk with your class teacher or fellow reps to discuss the specific role you will perform for your class and make some plans.
- Follow up with your class teacher for the class list of those families who were happy for you to have their contact details this may take a week or two to make sure everyone has had the opportunity to contact your class teacher – create a class WhatsApp.
- Contact the parents on your class list to introduce yourself.
- Consider organising a class social activity (e.g., a play at the park after school).

Children will be sent to classrooms from 7:15am, where their teacher will greet them.

Uniform

- Students should wear the regulatory school uniform with black leather shoes. The uniform can be purchased <u>here</u>.
- PE Kit should be worn with non-marking trainers.
- On days where students have PE, Swimming and Dance, they should come in their PE kit, and will remain in it for the day.
- Please be mindful of hygiene and encourage students to be clean and presentable.

Registration

- On the first day of school traffic is always heavy, please make time for this as part of your planning and car share where possible. Children must be ready to jump out the car and go.
- The registration period is from 7:30am 7:40am and takes place in the homerooms.
- Students can make their way to their homeroom from 7:15am.
 Any student arriving between 7am and 7:15am must remain in their assigned area.
- Register closes and lessons begin at 7:40. Please ensure your child has ample time to reach their classroom before this time.



Student Absence

- If your child is absent due to illness, please complete the <u>'Absence Notification Link'</u> before 08:00am of the day of the absence.
- If you are requesting leave for an extended period of time (3 or more days) submit the same form with reasons for the request.
 This will be subject to approval. We advise all non-essential

travel plans be restricted to the prescribed holidays, so as not to impact on your children's attendance record.




